LGBTQ-friendly affordable housing development cleared to rise in Logan Square

The seven-story complex replaces a parking lot along Milwaukee Avenue

A triangular, seven-story affordable-rate apartment building known as the John Pennycuff Memorial Apartments at Robert Castillo Plaza is <u>ready to break</u> ground in Logan Square. Slated for the northeast corner of Milwaukee and Campbell avenues, the transit-oriented project will include ground floor retail, 18 parking spaces, and 88 studio, one-, and two-bedroom apartments targeted towards LGBTQ tenants.

Developed by the non-profit Metropolitan Housing Development Corp. and designed by CSA Partners, the Logan Square apartments represent Chicago's second and largest LGBTQ-friendly affordable housing building to date. The concept builds off of the earlier success of Lakeview's Town Hall Apartments which opened in 2014.

In June, the Chicago Housing Authority board <u>authorized \$12.5 million</u> for Pennycuff's construction. Last month, the Chicago City Council voted to support the project with \$16 million in Multi-Family Housing Revenue Bonds plus \$564,000 in Low Income Housing Tax Credits that will generate \$5.7 million in equity.
